Speeding Traffic... No up to date figures to report this week. In February the Police & Crime Commissioner promised to put the Parishes traffic issues on the agenda of the next West Mercia Road Safety Team Forum and, promised an update. No update has been received yet and, this has now been requested. Remember, the grant money from the PCC is available again this year. Wrockwardine Fly Tipping



Cllr Bevis reported rubbish fly tipped at the top of Station Road, Wrockwardine. It has now been removed. Let the Clerk know if you see rubbish dumped in the Parish so that it can be reported and dealt with quickly.

Anti Social Behaviour – Admaston

Local residents have raised concerns about youths congregating on the field and basketball court at Admaston and using the car park as a mini racing track. Complaints about the anti-social behaviour had been made to West Mercia Police but the residents were unhappy with their response and it is disappointing that residents feel their issues are not being heard. The Clerk contacted the local policing team and spoke to the PCSO about the issues. The local PCSO made assurances that regular visits are made to all sites in Admaston and that this is a long-standing and on-going problem. The Clerk also raised the issue with Borough Cllr Paul Watling at a recent Zoom meeting with clerks and, he said he would raise the issue with officers of the Borough Council.

The Clerk witnessed rubbish and multiple small silver canisters strewn around the Youth Shelter on Admaston Green. These were immediately reported to IdVerde and cleared.

Allscott Meads Street Names

The Borough Council, following consultation with the Chair of the Licensing Committee, have confirmed that the following street names have been approved for the site at the Former British Sugar site:

The Borough Council thanked everyone for their input into the process and advised that they are now starting the allocation of official addresses.

Construction Traffic Issues

Reports were received that site traffic to the Allscott Meads development was going through Wrockwardine. SJ Roberts were immediately advised and they said that they would contact all their merchants and re-iterate that they should only be using the authorised route. At the last Stakeholders Group Meeting, SJ Roberts agreed to erect signage at the entrances to prohibited routes informing that there was no access to construction traffic. SJ Roberts have confirmed this signage is being delivered to the site early next week and will be installed on the routes immediately.
